Sea and island tourism currently accounts for about 70% of the activities of Vietnam's tourism industry and is increasingly becoming a new trend and driving force, playing a particularly important position in the tourism development strategy, making a fundamental contribution to the development of tourism and make it become a key economic sector of Vietnam.
